Hall Markets

Showgrounds, HALL ACT Held on first Sunday of month. Diverse range of stalls including some selling native plants.

Fetes and Open Days, Trash and Treasure Markets

Fund-raising ventures for a range of organisations including schools and individuals. Easily propagated plants may be on sale. If buying, ensure plants are not environmental weeds or invasive species. Plants need to survive Canberra's climate.

Warehouse Style and Supermarket Outlets

Some larger chain stores sell native plants (e.g. Bunnings and Mitre 10). Supermarkets may also stock native plants at times. They may sell native plants and other species regularly or occasionally. These plants may not be suited to or hardened-off for Canberra conditions.
